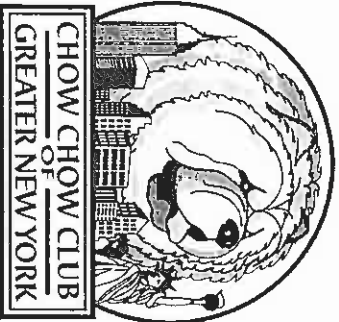

From Harrisburg International Airport and Lancaster - Travel I-283 West (toward Harrisburg) to I-83 South to Exit 41A (Camp Hill - Route 581 West). Then take Exit 5A (Camp Hill - Route 15 North). Follow Route 15 North for approximately 2 miles and the Radisson is on the left.
 From Philadelphia Area - Travel I-76 West (PA Turnpike) to Exit 236 (Gettysburg). Go North on Route 15 for approximately 5 miles, the Radisson is on the left.
 From Pittsburgh Area - Travel I-76 East (PA Turnpike) to Exit 236 (Gettysburg). Go North on Route 15 for approximately 5 miles, the Radisson is on the left.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS HOTEL & DOG SHOW RULES

- A "Rules for Guest Conduct Contract" will be given out at the Registration Desk of the Host Hotel. Anyone refusing to sign the contract will not be given a room under the umbrella of The Chow Chow Club, Inc.
- All guest should make a thorough check of their rooms upon arrival and report any damage - **Plastic is required under all dog crates.**
- A maximum of four (4) persons are permitted in each resort room.
- All dogs must be in crates when there is not a responsible person present in the room.
- Damages to the rooms are the responsibility of the occupant and must be settled with the hotel prior to departure, or future specialties will be denied.
- Keep your rooms clean and orderly. Housekeeping is required to check your room to be cleaned daily **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- Dogs must be on leash at all times or confined in their crates, except when being judged and groomed. Dogs must be on leash when walking in resort rooms, hallways or any public areas of the hotel. No dogs are allowed in or near any food service outlet. Dogs are not permitted poolside or in any public restrooms.
- Exercise dogs **ONLY** in the designated areas. Please clean up after exercising your dogs; equipment will be available for your convenience. Waste must be deposited in poop buckets provided by the club. If the area you are in does not have a bucket, it is **NOT** an exercise area.
- The Grooming Area is a privilege extended by the Chow Chow Club, Inc. and the Radisson Penn Harris Hotel and Convention Center, which, can and will be withdrawn from those who do not follow the instructions and rules of the Show Committee.
- Grooming allowed in designated areas only. A spacious grooming area will be provided. **NO BATHING AND GROOMING OF DOGS ALLOWED IN HOTEL ROOMS**, hallways or ballrooms. If there is any grooming found by the Hotel Staff or Show Committee in these areas, you will be asked to leave. Exhibitors are responsible for damages and clean up of their grooming area daily. Clean up supplies will be available.
- The Dog Wash (includes wet blow dry) will be held outdoors in the designated wash area.
- The Show Committee will lay out and govern the designated Grooming Area. Grooming space will be available on a first come, first served basis. No space may be roped off or held with empty crates. To assure room for all exhibitors, please conserve and share space. The Show Committee reserved the right to condense an exhibitors grooming area. **NO DOGS TO BE LEFT IN THE GROOMING ROOMS OVERNIGHT.**
- The Show Committee will govern the use of Private Exercise Pens. **NO** indoor exercise pens.
- There will be **NO** security guard on duty. **DO NOT** leave valuables out in the grooming areas. The Chow Chow Club, Inc., the Wine Country Chow Chow Association of New York, and the Radisson Penn Harris Hotel and Convention Center will not be responsible for anything stolen or damaged. Disruptive guests (and/or their dogs) may be asked to leave. **Dogs are not to create a nuisance by continually howling or barking.**
- Any damage to the hotel facilities (including grounds, parking lots) is up for disciplinary action by The Chow Chow Club, Inc. **Bench Show Committee and the American Kennel Club.**

ERRORS ON ENTRY BLANKS. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of his breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
