From Northeast:

Take I-95 South to Baltimore Beltway (695) West to I-70 West to Rt. 32 South. Turn right on Rt. 144 West to Fairgrounds Road on your right.

From Baltimore:

Take I-70 West from Baltimore Beltway (695) to Rt. 32 South. Turn right on Rt. 144 West to Fairgrounds Road on your right.

From Washington:

From the Washington Beltway (495) take I-270 North towards Frederick. Follow signs to I-70 East towards Baltimore to Rt. 32 South. Turn right on Rt. 144 West to Fairgrounds Road on your right.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES from Washington:

From the Washington-Baltimore Parkway (I-295) or I-95 North, take Rt. 32 West. Follow Rt. 32 and turn left on Rt. 144 West to Fairgrounds Road on your right.

From the Washington Beltway (495), take Georgia Avenue (Rt. 97) North. Turn right on Rt. 144 to Fairgrounds Road on your left.

REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS & VISITORS

- No fee at gate for entrance or parking in non-reserved spaces
- Grounds will be available after 1 PM on Wednesday (May 15) for parking and outside setup.
- Building will be available for exhibitors on Saturday
- Exhibitor vehicles not allowed in the building.
- Unloading at designated spaces located at front entrance.
- Site Control will supervise all grooming setups, and have the final authority on the setup and usage
 of grooming space.
- The use of soft sided crates will be allowed in the Obedience and Rally building.
- Site Control has the right to remove unapproved placement of equipment and chairs.
- Exhibitors and handlers will be responsible for clean conditions in and around their grooming area.
- All Exhibitors and Visitors shall respect the authority of Site Control, Event Officials and the Event Committee. Failure to do so may result in Event Committee Hearing and/or ejection from the show grounds.
- All dogs MUST be kept under control at all times. No Flexi-leads.
- Only those dogs entered in shows will be allowed in show building.
- Building will be open from 6:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M.
- Do not leave property unattended. The Clubs cannot be responsible for missing items.
- Event Buildings and perimeters are designated as NON-SMOKING areas.

★ NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS ★

- DOGS MAY ARRIVE any time prior to their scheduled time of judging. DOGS NOT REQUIRED for further judging will be excused.
- JUDGES WILL NOT WAIT FOR ANY DOG HOLDING UP A CLASS. Owners or agents alone are responsible for the presence of their dogs in the judging ring when their classes are called to be judged. The show-giving club and the superintendent have no obligation or responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.
- ALL DOGS PRESENT must be held on leash or confined to their crates except when being judged or when in the exercising ring.

CLASS CASH PAIZES will be paid in the ring to the person showing the dog. Claims for prize money must be made in the ring before the judging of that class is over, and the Show Secretary to be advised at once. The Show Secretary and Show-giving Club may disclaim any liability for cash prizes after the judging of the class is over.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to
 appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
